

Join us as we travel from the palm-covered road into Jerusalem on Palm/ Passion Sunday to the darkest hours after the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday, from the pleading prayers in the Garden of Gethsemane and Judas' betrayal, to the hill of Calvary on Good Friday. We are thankful that we will arrive at the empty tomb on Easter Sunday, when we can joyfully proclaim together: "He is risen! He is risen, indeed!"

April Worship Schedule

SUNDAY, APRIL 6

We'll spend this fifth Sunday in Lent in a more formal setting, sharing in responsive liturgy, singing parts of the service in a "high church" format. We'll also

come to the table for the sacrament of the Lord's Supper.

PALM/PASSION SUNDAY, APRIL 13

Holy Week begins with this service that moves from joyful refrains of "Hosanna!" to the dark story of Christ's Passion. Some dramatic reading will take place in this emerging service foreshadowing the events of the coming days.



"Maundy" comes from the Latin word for "commandment." On Thursday we recollect Iesus' commandment that we "love one another just as I have loved you." This service begins in the Gathering Place at 7:00PM, focusing on the events of the Last Supper, and then moves into the

> Sanctuary for a service of shadows. where we remember the arrest, trial, and crucifixion of Jesus. A meaningful service you won't want to miss.

EASTER SUNDAY, APRIL 20

Join in the resurrection celebration at our Easter morning service at 11:00AM. The sanctuary is always beautifully decorated, the songs joyfully uplifting, and the worship spirit-filled. We'll also share Communion together.

SUNDAY. APRIL 27

We relax into classic worship as the Easter season continues.

Cross-bound

This is typically the space where Pastor Michael would have his article. Due to his car accident and being away from the office for 2 weeks during recovery, we did not ask that he write anything for this month's newsletter.

This Lenten season, Pastor Michael challenged the congregation to read the daily devotional that our denominational magazine, *Presbyterians Today*, published. This small booklet entitled "Cross-bound" takes a detailed look for the entire 40-day period at the last week of Jesus' life. The group on Wednesday night has met to share thoughts about the devotions of the week.

Given that Holy Week is nearly upon us, it seemed appropriate to share the words and challenge set forth in the "Cross-bound" devotion by its author, Chip Hardwick.

"When the days drew near for him to be taken up, he set his face to go to Jerusalem.—Luke 9:51


Jesus has already foretold his coming death—twice—when he sets his face toward his crucifixion. Instead of running away from suffering, he moves toward it, step by step. He is bound for the cross, and by the end of his journey, he will be bound to the cross. He is, in a word, cross-bound.

Along his journey, Jesus challenges those around him to move toward the cross. He marches into Jerusalem on that first Palm Sunday and becomes increasingly cross-bound with every minute, while his followers struggle to bind themselves to him in his passion.

He calls *us* to take up our cross and follow him, too. Jesus challenges us to put others before ourselves and join God's mission to transform the world in love. The cross-bound life seeks not to glorify the Christian but to glorify Christ. The cross-bound life serves and sacrifices and endures. It relies on Jesus' strength in order to follow Jesus' example of setting his face toward Calvary—not for his own benefit but for ours.

Like Jesus' original disciples, we often resist the cross. This Lenten study invites you instead to embrace it. But that embrace does not mean giving into the violence perpetrated on us by an abuser. Neither does it mean justifying the suffering that comes about because of the fallen nature of the world—poverty, illness, or injustice. In fact, a cross-bound life fights against such things.

I pray that this Lent we will not simply read about the cross but be bound for it and bound to it—that, like Jesus, we will learn to live cross-bound lives of sacrificial love as we await the resurrection."



REBUILDING HOPE AFTER A DISASTER

"God put me in the right place at the right time."

Bobbi Updegraff saw the healing power of PDA while traveling the world as a writer for *Mission Mosiac* Magazine, and took part in organizing youth camps at PDA volunteer villages after Hurricane Katrina. She never fathomed her own community would need the same kind of help until the day Hurricane Irene hit.

Bobbi's previous experience, along with guidance and encouragement from PDA, enabled her to be a part of the response. As mission chair of her home presbytery in Pennsylvania (Northumberland), Bobbi worked with local Presbyterian churches helping prepare them to host volunteers, and she worked with the long-term recovery organization (LTRO) in identifying the most urgent needs. OGHS funds were the first used by the LTRO.

Updegraff recounts the rebuilding effort: "I cannot tell you what it felt like to receive the first teams of blue shirts to my area. It made me very proud to be a Presbyterian Christian. God faithfully demonstrated that we can not only survive—but bless others."

Give to One Great Hour of Sharing to help transform suffering into healing and hope by supporting programs like Presbyterian Disaster Assistance. FPCE will collect this offering on Palm Sunday and Easter Sunday. Fish boxes will also be distributed to youth to collect coins.
