Signs of the New Year, some are different for everyone of us; some are the same for all of us. But a new year calls us to pause, and count the ways our lives as individuals and as a

community are changing. Let me share a few of the changes I am experiencing

- in my own life, you are encouraged to add your own:
  The Christmas gift that drew the loudest shout of bannings from my children's line? Clething!
- happiness from my children's lips? Clothing! Alleluia! *Nerf Guns* begone!
- This will be the first year that Heather's and my Dad will not be ringing in the new year with us. Though they will be missed deeply, our resurrection hope is a great comfort to us.
- A new church. New church family. New friends. New opportunities. New challenges. A new way for God to work his will through us.

Some changes we will experience together.

- A new pastor. Wonder what will be different?
- The work of the Pastoral Nominating Committee will begin in earnest.
- Fiscal cliff? Health Care plan to go into effect? USA pulls out of Afghanistan. Gun control debate? Yikes! Pray for our nation and its leaders. Pray for our congregation to respond with grace, justice and love.

As I look into the year ahead of us, one prayer rushes through my heart, mind and soul. Evangelism. God is on the move, lives are touched, hopes are kindled, how to get the word "out there?"

Few words make Presbyterians as uncomfortable and nervous as *evangelism*. How can we invite without being pushy? How can we share the good news of the gospel with integrity and non-judgmentally? How can we be ourselves and be "inviting?" I ponder and pray over these questions day and night. Honestly. I sat behind the pulpit on Christmas Eve and asked God— "Lord, what must I do, what must we do, for the sanctuary to be this full every Sunday morning?"

The Lord, with a patient, gentle, still and quiet voice, has spoken twice:

- 1. Pray. Pray for the Lord of the harvest to bless us who work in the field of Edgewood. Pray for the Lord to increase our number. Pray earnestly. Pray every day. And then....listen.
- Be a friend to our neighbors. Be there for our neighbors. We don't need to create "big events." We do need to be real friends. And if I've witnessed anything since joining you three months

ago- FPCE is full of good people. People who can be good friends.

An early leader in the church, John Chrysostom (347-407) wisely advised the fledgling Christian Church: "This is the rule of the most perfect Christianity, its most exact definition, its highest point, namely, the seeking of the common good...for nothing can so make a person an imitator of Christ as caring for neighbors."

These two thoughts that have encouraged me. Neither are difficult; both are something all of us can do.

Before departing after the Christmas Eve service, Shaun made an interesting observation; "We're the best kept secret in Edgewood!"

Do you agree with him? That can be changed. That is my first prayer for us in 2013. I hope you will join me. Let us pray.

# THANKOFFERING January 20, 2013




