A Return to "Ordinary" Time

Happy New Year! We made it through a busy Advent and Christmas season together and now we settle down for a quieter time in the life of the church. While nothing about our lives in the past 18 months has been "ordinary," in the church calendar we are about to enter a period of the liturgical year that is called exactly that.

"Ordinary Time" covers two large spans of time per year: the time between Christmas and Lent, and then the time between Pentecost and Advent. The first span of Ordinary Time begins after Epiphany and Baptism of the Lord Sunday (January 9) and runs through the Tuesday before Lent, ending the day before Ash Wednesday (which falls on March 2 this year), commonly known as Shrove Tuesday or Fat Tuesday when Mardi Gras festivities occur. The second span of Ordinary Time begins after Pentecost (June 5) and runs until the first Sunday of Advent in late November.

Ordinary Time is a time when we grow, nurture, and reflect on living our lives as followers of Christ. The color green is used to represent the Holy Spirit, eternalness, life and hope. Green is also the color of new vegetation and symbolizes all living things. It is used to signify the hope of new life, and to represent the promise of new life which is ours in the life of Jesus Christ, our Lord. Look for touches of green in the sanctuary and service, reflecting God's love for creation.

We continue our Sunday morning worship at 11:00AM in the sanctuary with various guest pastors, liturgists, and members of our music ministry. The service is livestreamed on Facebook and then posted to YouTube and SoundCloud within the next day or 2 for online viewing and listening.

Ianuary 2: We observe the Feast of the Epiphany in a special service of the Christmas Story for the Ninth Day of Christmas. My Gifts... More than the gifts we often sing about for the 12 Days of Christmas, the Feast of the Epiphany celebrates the arrival of the Three Wise Men that have come to pay their respects to the Infant lesus. This special service will feature the stories of the three visitors from the East through an original readers' theater production written by Jim & Lisa Segedy, and performed by several members of our congregation.

Who were these unusual visitors? Where did they come from and why? What is the meaning of their gifts? Together we will learn the stories behind these visitors' background and their unique gifts, the meaning of the Twelve Days of Christmas, and more. Adventure awaits...

January 9: Baptism of the Lord Sunday with Communion. We welcome back to our pulpit the Rev. Fairlight Collins Lower to lead us in the Sacrament of the Lord's Supper in this service where we recall the promises made in our own baptism while recognizing the day when our Lord was baptized.

January 16: Justice Sunday Emerging Worship with the worship ensemble providing music and the Rev. Bob Ruefle returning to lead our service.

January 23: Rev. Ruefle preaches during the service and will moderate the congregational meeting following worship.

January 30: Jason Dauer returns to the pulpit to lead worship.

DID YOU KNOW...

...that only ordained Ministers of Word and Sacrament may lead us in sacraments (baptism, communion, ordination/installation of officers and new members)? Several of our guest pastors have their degrees from seminary but are not yet ordained ministers through the Presbytery's ordination process. They become candidates and must take several exams then come before the Commission on Ministry for approval to be ordained. The worship committee has made sure that on weeks we've held sacraments or official church business that the person leading us has the title of "Reverend" before their name as an ordained pastor.

Session Notes

At Their December 14, 2021 Meeting, the Session of FPCE voted to:

- Place the names of new members Elizabeth and Ethan Headlee into the church rolls.
- Change the date of the next Congregational meeting from January 30 to January 23, 2022.
- Reduce our voting membership by 10, to 72, following the recommendation of the committee to move 10 members to participation status. These members will receive all pastoral services provided to voting members.
- Session also thanked retiring Elder Nancy Ernst for her service.

Pastoral Search Update

As Tyler told the membership at our December congregational meeting, the PNC is making good progress in the search process. To date, we have reviewed more than 50 Pastor Information Forms, listened to or viewed at least 15 sermons online, sent several invitations for first



round interviews, and even conducted 2 Zoom interviews as of the printing of this newsletter.

We will start up our regular meetings again after a brief holiday recess and continue reviewing PIFs, determining which matches we think fit with our mission as FPCE and who we might like to speak with. Note that there are 2 different types of matches we work from – self-referrals, who are pastors that have seen our Ministry Information Form online and are specifically interested in us; and online matches through the Church Leadership Connection website, which take the information from PIFs and MIFs to match location, church size and demographics, and leadership competencies. Those matched through the CLC website do not know they have matched with us unless we invite them to a discussion, so some of the folks we reach out to may not necessarily be interested in us specifically even if we are interested. You can imagine there is a lot of waiting on replies and coordinating schedules, but rest assured that we are working expeditiously within the guidelines we've been given. Please continue to pray for the committee, the process, and God's guidance as we work to discern the best fit to be the shepherd of our FPCE family.

A repairman was in during the last week of December to work on it and informed us that the model we have installed is not a commercial stair lift and therefore would not be in compliance with inspections for a public building. Treasurer's Report

As of December 31, 2021 the income and expense for FPCE are as follows:

Total Income - \$197,061.70 Actual YTD Budget - \$208,564.00 Total Expense - \$179,664.60 Actual YTD Budget - \$208,564.00

Actual income is below budget by \$11,502.30, but actual expense is below budget by \$28,899.40 so FPCE has a cash surplus of \$17,397.10 for 2021. Account 4010 -Donations continue to be the major income concern. Expenses were below budget because a part time Pastor was employed for less than a full year and utility and maintenance expenses were under budget.
