GATHERING

PRELUDE

WELCOME

Leader: The Lord be with you. **People:** And also with you.

TOLLING OF THE HOUR

*CALL TO WORSHIP (responsive)

The Lord is my light and salvation; whom shall I fear?

The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

One thing I asked of the Lord, that I will seek after: to live in the house of the Lord all the days of my life. Let us worship God.

We invite you to read all **bold** words aloud with the community

We start services with a "Call to Worship" to establish the context for worship as an encounter with the Holy One who calls all things into being.

Holy One, you meet us where we are and call us to step forth in faith. Claim us as disciples, and strengthen us by your Spirit to follow you faithfully, that we may share good news with all; through Christ our Savior. **Amen.**

CALL TO CONFESSION

Come

People of God, in the covenant of baptism we are claimed in Christ and called to be saints.

Therefore, with faith and confidence let us confess our sin and ask for God's grace, calling on the name of our Savior and Lord.

We turn from communal praise to corporate confession, not for shame nor in guilt, but to wrestle honestly with the impact we have on each other. We do so with the knowledge of God's grace for all people.

PRAYER OF CONFESSION (unison)

Holy One, in your presence, we confess our captivity to sin and our resistance to your way.

You have chosen what is foolish to shame the wisdom of this world, but we boast in our knowledge and ignore the insights of others.

You have chosen what is weak to shame the powers of this world, but we boast in our strength and refuse the gifts of others.

You have chosen what is despised to shame the values of this world, but we boast in our merits and reject the worth of others.

Forgive us, Holy One.

Renew and reshape our lives with the message of the cross.

Teach us to boast in nothing but the crucified and risen one: Jesus the Christ, our Lord.

DECLARATION OF FORGIVENESS

Christ is the wisdom of God. Christ is the power of God. Christ is the glory of God. In the name of Jesus, the Christ, we are forgiven. **Thanks be to God.**

***SHARING THE PEACE OF CHRIST**

As Christ has forgiven us, let us forgive one another: The peace of Christ be with you all. And also with you.

*RESPONSE

"We are Forgiven"

PROCLAIMING GOD'S WORD

PRAYER FOR ILLUMINATION

Send your Spirit, O God, to search us and teach us. Help us to understand the wisdom of your way. Give us the mind of Christ—by whose gracious word we live And in whose holy name we pray. Amen.

As we read these passages, allow your mind to focus on one sentence or word—you don't need to comprehend it all! How might the Spirit be speaking to you today through these ancient words? What questions do you have?

For its burdensome yoke the rod on its shoulders, the club of its oppressor—You smashed, as on the day of Midian.

The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

PSALM 27 (responsive)

The LORD is my light and my salvation; whom shall I fear?

The LORD is the stronghold of my life; whom should I dread?

There is one thing I ask of the LORD, only this do I seek:

to live in the house of the LORD all the days of my life,

to gaze on the beauty of the LORD, to inquire at his temple.

I believe I shall see the LORD'S goodness in the land of the living.

GOSPEL READING Matthew 4:12-23 NRSVUE

Now when Jesus heard that John had been arrested, he withdrew to Galilee. He left Nazareth and made his home in Capernaum by the sea, in the territory of Zebulun and Naphtali, so that what had been spoken through the prophet Isaiah might be fulfilled:

Land of Zebulun, land of Naphtali, on the road by the sea, across the Jordan, Galilee of the gentiles the people who sat in darkness have seen a great light, and for those who sat in the region and shadow of death light has dawned. **RGP**

From that time Jesus began to proclaim, "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near."

As Jesus walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the sea—for they were fishers. And he said to them, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of people." Immediately they left their nets and followed him. As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

Jesus went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.
