# **MOMENT FOR STEWARDSHIP...**

Stewardship is a spiritual matter; it is more than looking at dollars and cents. As Christians, we are asked to be good stewards of what is in our realm. While finances may be tabulated, how do we measure stewardship? The answer may not be simple; let me start by giving a summary of how FPCE has done over the first half of the year. Our donations (excluding Special Offerings) through May 2013 have totaled \$66,658.55. This represents 96% of the amount we had expected to collect (as per our budget). Even better, we contributed \$1917.86 toward Special Offerings such as One Great Hour of Sharing, Thank Offering, and Tools of Hope. This amount exceeds the budget expectation of \$1458.31. These numbers are encouraging and show that we care about God and about each other.

At our recent meeting reviewing the results of the Church Survey (Church Assessment Tool), Rev. Doug Portz from the Pittsburgh Presbytery estimated that the FPCE congregation gave approximately 4% of its income to the church. This figure is above the national average of 2-3% and underscores our spirit. Also, these figures remind me of what our previous Rev. Mike Wilson had taught us - that we are in the "between time": between the already and not yet. Our giving is on the right track and yet we have a road ahead to reach tithing (10%).

How have we been using our resources? The majority goes toward running the church and providing spirit-filled worship services with excellent music thanks be to God! In addition, FPCE assists the Wilkinsburg Community Ministry and offers a number of community activities including FROGS, Vacation Bible School, Thanksgiving meal, and the recent Wednesday Evening Community Dinner, which was a great success! All of these activities help bring the Kingdom closer to us - we are on the right track.

Lastly, I would like to close with a guote from the Didache (early Christian teaching on morality and practices). "Let your alms sweat in your hands until you know to whom to give them" (1:6). How would you interpret this statement? The early church was small and had many struggles and yet it grew to what it is today. When we give, the Lord does not short-change us. "Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house ... and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so many blessings that you will not have room enough for it". (Malachi 3:10) Let us pray, increase our faith, grow in Spirit, and become better stewards.
