
# **SUMMER WORSHIP SCHEDULE** In-person and Facebook Live at 10:30AM

Summer Worship begins at 10:30AM and takes place in the Gathering Place. Please be aware that our safety practice of locking the side transept entrance at the beginning of the service continues, but you can still enter the Gathering Place through the back door facing the elementary school once worship begins. Services are livestreamed on Facebook and then posted to YouTube.

**July 2:** Jesus teaches on hospitality and welcome (Matthew 10:40-42). We will celebrate communion this week.

**July 9:** The disciples tell Jesus that others are calling him a glutton and a drunkard! (Matthew 11:16-19, 25-30)

**July 16:** Jesus tells the Parable of the Sower (Matthew 13:1-9, 18-23). Rudeene Jackson will be offering pulpit supply this Sunday while Pastor Jason is attending the Wild Goose Festival in North Carolina.



**July 30:** Jesus continues with more parables: the mustard seed, the yeast, the treasure hidden in the field, and pearl, the net thrown in the sea (Matthew 13:31-33, 44-52)

**August 6:** Jesus heals the sick and feeds 5,000 men plus many more women and children (Matthew 14:13-21). We will celebrate communion this week!

August 13: The disciples cry out, "It is a ghost!" after seeing Jesus on water toward their boat (Matthew 14:22-33)

**August 20:** We learn more about Jesus's human nature. Jesus says to a Canaanite woman that he did not come to save her or her people, and she pushes back on his prejudices and biases (Matthew 15:21-28)

**August 27:** "Who do people say that the Son of Man is?" (Matthew 16:13-20)

As we continue our monthly conversation on what it means to be a "Vital Congregation," let's take a look at another "mark" of a vital congregation: "Empowering Servant Leadership." The Matthew 25 Initiative defines this as...

All people of God, in the image of Christ, are given fruit of the Spirit and spiritual gifts meant for building up the Church. In this way, we are all called to serve the Lord, to do our part in membership of the body of Christ. Every part is necessary. Every part is valuable, and every voice is important. Every person should be equipped, nurtured, and supported to use their gifts to glorify God, through servant leadership; not just cliques of powerful people or continual burnout of the same leaders. In keeping with true Discipleship Formation, churches are called to help all members to be empowered to use their gifts in servant leadership. And, God calls and equips some for the particular task of pastoral ministry, which must be cultivated, nurtured and trained. Ministry can never be about a single pastor, but it is about identifying, equipping and empowering those servant leaders God puts in our midst.

The line that stands out to me is "Ministry can never be about a single pastor." I had a friend recently leave their congregation, and in their departing message, they wrote similar words. Now I don't have to tell this to you. FPCE knows well that the pastor is only a cog—like everyone else. All of us work together to do ministry. It's not about any one of us; it's about all of us working together to bring glory to God.

I know nothing about arranging choral pieces, playing piano, reconciling bank statements, teaching kindergarten, sewing banners for the sanctuary, waxing the social hall's floor, or making cream puffs. Those are gifts others have—not me. We need all of them to do the work of Christ in our neighborhood.

But sometimes, we're wary about sharing the gifts we have. We don't tell others about the things we can do because we don't trust in ourselves, or we've been burned by others exploiting our gifts. We face burnout. Not using our gifts or using gifts to the extreme doesn't glorify God. Because to glorify God means that we show God's presence through our work and love.

"Every part is necessary. Every part is valuable, and every voice is important." What gifts do you have that you can bring to the table, to this community?

AND how do we accept the gifts of others? How do we honor what someone else brings into the room with listening ears and open hearts? Do we jump to quick assumptions about their gifts, or do we let them express them? Do we eat their casserole? Do we let them teach and lead us in music? Do we trust them to do what they say they will do?

These are some of the things I'm thinking about right now as we consider how to empower servant leadership. What can I do, what can the Session do, what can our congregation do... to foster the gifts in our community and not become a "clique of power people" or cause "continual burnout of the same leaders"?

Is there something you've always wanted to try but never felt the freedom to? Is there a skill you'd like to share? Or have you been doing something for a long time and would like a sabbath to restore the gifts God has given you?

## **Tuesday Morning Book Club**




## Wednesday Zoom Bible Study

## Bronwen Boswell named Acting Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the PC(USA)

The Shenandoah Presbytery leader to take office in July Rick Jones | Office of the General Assembly - June 22, 2023

#### LOUISVILLE

The Committee on the Office of the General Assembly has announced that the Rev. Bronwen Boswell has been named Acting Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) Boswell, who is currently general presbyter/stated clerk at Shenandoah Presbytery, will serve until the election of a new stated clerk at the 226<sup>th</sup> General Assembly in Salt Lake City, Utah, next summer. She will fill the



unexpired term of the Rev. Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II, who recently announced his decision to step down at the end of June.

"Despite the quick turnaround from the Stated Clerk's announcement to when we needed to fill the Acting position, COGA was able to thoughtfully and intentionally review [Personal Information Forms] and resumes, as well as engage in generative conversations with potential candidates," said Teaching Elder Eliana Maxim, COGA moderator. "It became quite apparent that Bronwen understood the unique complexities of this transitional position as well as had the experience to step into ongoing processes in preparation for the General Assembly next summer in Salt Lake City."

Boswell is a graduate of St. Andrews Presbyterian College and received her Master of Divinity from Princeton Theological Seminary. She has served in a number of presbytery and mid council leadership roles, as well as interim pastorates in the PC(USA). She is married to the Rev. Dr. Howard W. Boswell, Jr., pastor of Buena Vista Presbyterian Church in Buena Vista, Virginia. They have four children—three who are ordained deacons and the fourth is on the associate pastor nominating committee at his church.

Boswell says she is ready to begin her new role with the Office of the General Assembly.

"I am humbled and excited by this opportunity to serve the denomination in this way. It truly is a call, by COGA and the Holy Spirit," she said. "I had looked at the possibility when it was first posted and thought that there were probably others best suited for the position, but I received a phone call that asked me to consider applying and I thought — what could that hurt? And lo and behold, here we are."

Boswell joins the staff at a pivotal time in the denomination as the Office of the General Assembly and Presbyterian Mission Agency begin the move toward unification.

"Bronwen understands the framework of the OGA's work as well as its values, responsibilities, and people," said Maxim. "She will be a faithful leader and colleague in preparation for the upcoming Assembly and conversations with the Unification Commission."

Boswell will officially begin her new duties on July 10.

"My task, as I see it, as Acting Stated Clerk, is to be a bridge in this in between time of elected Stated Clerks, preparing General Assembly and working with the committees that will need to report to GA next year, specifically the Commission on Unification," said Boswell. "My background as a presbytery stated clerk, mid-council leader and interim pastor along with my years as a parliamentarian for GA committees and plenary sessions should stand me in good stead as I seek to lead in this interim time with energy, intelligence, imagination and love."
