ASTOR'S NEW DINO

Thirty years gone by — my how things have changed! We can all say that, can't we? From your workplace to your home to the way we go shopping - nothing's the same!

Nearly thirty years ago I walked into my first pastorate. About that time, I read a piece of advice from one of those experienced, wise, pastor-turned-authors who wrote: When you're new to a church, find the heart of your

congregation and beat in time with it. I interpreted that to mean that as a new pastor I should walk beside, feed, encourage, pray for and support the servant-leaders who have worked so hard for so long. I believe I learned how to do that pretty well.

One major problem: in every church I have served (save one) as the leadership got older, the congregation grew smaller. There were fewer and fewer people to walk beside.

So, about fifteen years ago, I looked for some new wisdom from successful church leaders. I found a few of them, and basically, they said the same thing in their own way: Seek out the fringe people—learn how to feed them with the good news of Christ—then open your doors. I interpret that to mean it's time to look outward not inward; time to seek out the seekers; time to serve people who aren't in the church—yet.

Pastor's Point of View (cont. from page 1)



We might not be able to define a fringe person, but we know who they are, don't we? Those who have strayed, never felt at home, have "issues", made wrong turns—people who don't believe they fit in. People who need to be reached and touched with the same gospel of the Risen Jesus Christ but in different ways.

As a pastor, and, you, as a church member, must ask our selves how to do that? Is there anything wrong with "beating in time" with the heart of the church? Absolutely not. Is there anything wrong with reaching out to the people who haven't found their way to the One who is "the way, the truth, and the life?" Absolutely not.

So how do pastors and church members do their jobs? Should we focus on the people within or the people without? Should we stop serving the current leadership and begin serving whoever is "out there?"

I believe I have an answer. Ideally—and the New Testament abounds with these kinds of stories— when the heart of the church is full of compassion and a strong desire to reach those who are "on the fringe;" God is able to do amazing things. The Holy Spirit springs to life and brings new life in new and unexpected ways.

I wonder if the FPCE family is ready to look beyond the walls, beyond those who are and always will be "present and accounted for?" Is the leadership...are the members...of FPCE ready to seek out the seekers? To live with those on the fringe?

As I close, I am going to challenge each of us to do one thing over the next month. Look around your neighborhood, think about those you work with, play with, talk with, run into every week— seek out a fringe person in your life. I am certain each one of us knows at least one. Think of that person. Pray for that person. Pray for her several times a day or more! Pray for him at night before you go to bed and in the morning when you wake up. Pray for that person and ask God how we, the daughters and sons of God at FPCE, can serve them with the same grace, love and humility that we show one another. Invite them into our hearts. Will you do that? Thank you. One piece of advice that has not changed in the past thirty years. All growth begins with prayer.



Some sobering statistics:

On any given Sunday there are 13 million more women than men in America's churches

Midweek church activities draw 70-80% more female participants

Over 70% of boys raised in the church will abandon it during their teens and twenties

Only 1 of 6 self described "Christian" men attends church regularly

Fewer than 10% of U.S. churches are able to establish or maintain a Men's ministry Lack of male participation is strongly associated with congregational decline

PER CAPITA APPORTIONMENT

Each year, FPCE contributes its share to the Presbytery, the Synod, and the General Assembly for ecclesiastical purposes. The amount is determined by the number of active members in the congregation. For FPCE, the amount is \$3500 or \$23.65 Per Capita. Our church pays this amount upfront and it is up to us to contribute our share. This "pay forward" example is similar to how Jesus had paid for our sins before our asking. So, the question becomes—how do we respond?






