SCRIPTURE

Genesis 15:1-12, 17-18

Later the Lord spoke to Abram in a vision, "Abram, don't be afraid! I will protect you and reward you greatly."² But Abram answered, "Lord All-Powerful, you have given me everything I could ask for, except children. And when I die, Eliezer of Damascus will get all I own. ³ You have not given me any children, and this servant of mine will inherit everything."

⁴ The Lord replied, "No, he won't! You will have a son of your own, and everything you have will be his." ⁵ Then the Lord took Abram outside and said, "Look at the sky and see if you can count the stars. That's how many descendants you will have." ⁶ Abram believed the Lord, and the Lord was pleased with him. So Abram's faith made him right with the Lord. ⁷ The Lord said to Abram, "I brought you here from Ur in Chaldea, and I gave you this land." ⁸ Abram asked, "Lord God, how can I know the land will be mine?" ⁹ Then the Lord told him, "Bring me a three-year-old cow, a three-year-old female goat, a three-year-old ram, a dove, and a young pigeon." ¹⁰ Abram obeyed the Lord. Then he cut the animals in half and laid the two halves of each animal opposite each other on the ground. But he did not cut the doves and pigeons in half. ¹¹ And when birds came down to eat the animals, Abram chased them away. ¹² As the sun was setting, Abram fell into a deep sleep, and everything became dark and frightening.

¹⁷ Sometime after sunset, when it was very dark, a smoking cooking pot and a flaming fire went between the two halves of each animal. ¹⁸ At that time the LORD made an agreement with Abram and told him: "I will give your descendants from the Nile River in Egypt to the River Euphrates in Assyria."

and satisfied our thirst from desert springs.


On the holy mountain you gave us your law to guide us in your way.

Help us, O God, to be obedient to your call to love all your children, to do justice and show mercy, and to live in peace with your whole creation. Guide us through the desert of life, quench our thirst with the living waters, satisfy our hunger with the bread of heaven.
