PASTOR'S ASTORYS ASTORYS

become? What have I learned about myself these past several years? What are my strengths? What skills/abilities do I need to develop? What parts of me need to be left behind? What new directions are beckoning me forward?

In-between-times can be very fruitful and productive. Dreams that have remained beneath the surface have an opportunity to be born. Unfruitful areas of life can be pruned. New ways of "being the church" can take root in soil now lying fallow.

I will warn you of one common temptation to be avoided. A congregation cannot go "back to the past." Every church I have served had its "glory days": a time when the sanctuary was full, the Sunday School program burst out of its rooms, the fellowship was amazing and serving the community and world in Christ's name came naturally. Celebrate those days, give thanks for them, commemorate them but remember, those days will not come back. The world is changed, the community is changed, the membership is changed, the future is ahead of us, not the past. What kind of leadership does FPCE need to move into the future with energy and enthusiasm (literally, "in-God-ism!")? That's the big question!!!

The Interim Ministry trainers divided this "in-between-time" into stages:

- 1. Termination celebrating but (however reluctantly) closing the door on the chapter in FPCE's life that has come to an end.
- 2. Direction-finding Learning about the next steps that need to be taken before calling a new pastor. The session will work closely with the interim pastor and Presbytery representative to achieve this goal
- 3. Self-study An "unhurried process of the congregation looking at itself, gathering
- 4. Search Seeking, interviewing, praying with, praying for the PNC, the congregation and the person God has called to be the next pastor. This is a highly confidential step in the process.
- 5. The Decision This is the joyful time when the search committee and the next pastor "find one another" and affirm that God is calling the congregation and new pastor to walk the next stage of their journeys together.
- 6. Negotiation This is an important step, as the congregation and new pastor work through the details of expectations, compensation, start-up date, etc.
- 7. Installation/Start-up Celebrate! It's a new day...a new beginning...a time when God will take another step in "making all things new."

My role, as an Interim Pastor is two-fold. I am to serve you as a Pastor is called to do, i.e. lead worship, preach, administer sacraments, perform weddings and funerals, make hospital visits, moderate session, etc. But I have to be careful to not become so dedicated to being your pastor that I neglect the important ministry of leading FPCE through this interim period. I am to walk you through the interim steps. I will be working very closely with the session as we do this. (A note: I will not be working with the Pastoral Nomination Committee, they will work closely with presbytery.)

There's the outline of what a lies ahead of us. Let's all take a deep breath and open our ears and heart to the voice of the shepherd who assures us in John 10:14: "I am the good shepherd. I know my own, my own know me." The shepherd is leading us to new pastures. Let us follow.



COMMUNITY THANKSGIVING DAY DINNER, 12-4PM

This outreach event has brought hot, home-cooked meals to many Edgewood homebound residents, provided fellowship for those without families to spend the day with, and a given a holiday pick-me-up for service workers at the police, fire, and EMT stations in the area. The entire meal is donated and prepared by church and community members. If you would be interested in helping to prepare the meal, cook an extra turkey at home to donate, provide

canned or boxed donations, serve the meal, or deliver take-out meals, please contact Judy at the church office to get signed up. All hands and hearts are welcome for this important hands-on act of compassion toward the Edgewood and surrounding communities.

Organizational plans are already underway to get ready for the day. Here is what is needed: 20 turkeys (at least 10 cooked and delivered to the church before 10AM on Thursday). Other donated turkeys can be roasted the day before by needed volunteers. Will also need vegetables and potatoes (we will have the food drive donated by Shadyside Academy delivered on Nov. 19 which will help with peas, corn, sweet potatoes, stuffing mix, gravy, etc.). Lists of needed donations of other traditional homemade side dishes such as mashed potatoes, sweet potatoes/yams, (watch out for upcoming BOGO's in store ads), stuffing mix, gravy, rolls, butter, pies, etc. will be posted/listed on the side vestibule bulletin board. Volunteers are needed the day before (Wednesday) to peal potatoes, set up tables, chairs, decorate tables, cut butter, make stuffing, run dishes through dishwasher (time to be announced). Then on the big day (Turkey Day) 10 people are needed to set up serving stations and prepare food for delivery (delivery begins 11-11:30AM), clear tables during dinner/refill drink containers, plus 2 clean up crews (3-5PM) and 5-7PM) with everyone returning to their own homes by 7PM. If you will be out of town and cannot participate, feel free to send a donation of food beforehand or a check made out to FPCE with Thanksgiving Dinner in the memo line (for various supplies such as butter, milk, onions, spices, etc. that need to be bought).

Watch for upcoming bulletin inserts and sign-ups on bulletin boards to help in any way.

There's a new TV show on called "The New Normal." And, while it has absolutely nothing to do with anything relating to our music ministry, it centers around how things change when different people come into each other's lives and how they adjust to new ways of being...a "new" normal. Well, we're about a month into our time with Pastor Michael and we're learning the ins and outs of what our "new normal" in worship & music ministries has - and will - become.

Thanks to everyone who stayed faithful during our transition period and to all of those who have been supporting our church leadership in this adventure of Christian life together. In just a few short weeks during October, we experienced World Communion Sunday complete with music from many cultures; classic worship with organ, piano, and choir; the Harvest Happening, which included the tripping of the fire alarm during worship; and another installment of our signature Emerging Worship services.

For November, it will be more creation of this feeling of the "new normal" as we wrap up the church liturgical year and prepare for the beginning of Advent in December. The choir will continue its solid music leadership during our classic worship services (November 4, 11, and 25), and the worship ensemble will provide richness to the music infused into our emerging service on November 18. As Pastor Michael and I have a chance to continue talking, planning, and working with our worship ministry team, we'll craft exciting and creative ways to worship together. I'm looking forward to the things we'll do to prepare the way for the Christ Child.



I'm also excited to report that we are making very strong progress toward the purchase of our denomination's new hymnal, *Glory to God.* As of October 15, we had passed the half-way mark of \$1,500 toward our goal of purchasing 150 new hymnals, and I know that donations were still coming in. In fact, I received 3 of them before and after worship on October 28 totaling another \$250, so thank you to all of you who have contributed to this initiative. Just as a reminder, we're hoping to take advantage of the discounted pricing the PC(USA) is offering by putting in our order and submitting payment to them by December 31st, even though the books will not be printed and distributed until early summer.

One thing I will need an opinion on before ordering is which color we should purchase! In the coming weeks, I'll send out an e-mail with a link to an online poll where you can let us know if we should get RED or PURPLE hymnals for our sanctuary. I believe the majority of folks are for the red option since they will match the carpet and the pew bibles, but that's just a quick informal poll in casual conversations with people. I want to be a good Presbyterian and get a general consensus by a vote! So, look for the e-mail, and if you don't have access to e-mail or are not on our church's distribution list, feel free to call in to the office and just let Judy know if you think we should buy RED or PURPLE. Thanks again for your continued support of the music ministry at FPCE.

I look forward to continuing to explore our "new normal" with the ever-changing and special family we know and love as the Edgewood congregation.
