We (reluctantly in my case) turn the clocks back one hour on November 2, a sure sign that the season of autumn is upon us. The changing of the seasons reminds us of the powerful and profound observation of "The Teacher", author of Ecclesiastes: **"For everything there is a season and a time for every matter under heaven."** That insight, in turn,

reminds me of a line from a Call to Worship we sometimes read on Sunday morning. *"All rhythms of time beat in God's great heart..."*

Since ancient times, the season of autumn has been a time to harvest ("to pluck up what has been planted.") The harvest season then led into a celebration or service of thanksgiving to the God in whose heart beat all rhythms of time.

We Presbyterians enter the autumn season of harvest and thanksgiving as an opportunity for stewardship. For stewardship is not only about fundraising, stewardship is our way of saying:

"Thank you God for the rich harvest of grace, blessing, peace, community, beauty and joy we are able to harvest when we sow seeds of faith in you. Thank you God for not only becoming like us in Jesus, but literally burying your heart in this earth that people of faith and the entire creation will be raised and harvested into a new life!"

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Brothers and sisters, thank you for treasuring this fellowship. Thank you for giving a generous thanks to God through the ministry and mission of the First Presbyterian Church of Edgewood!

Thanksgiving Dinner (Reluctantly) Cancelled





The Meaning of Advent

The word ADVENT means "coming" or "arrival." The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of Christ the King in his Second Advent. In this double focus on past and future, Advent also symbolizes the Spiritual Journey of individuals and congregations, as they affirm that Christ has come, that he is present in the world today, and that he will come again in power. Advent is marked by a spirit of expectation, of anticipation, of preparation, and of longing. We do this in many ways. We prepare our homes for The Holidays. We decorate with trees and lights, and prepare many different types of food. In the church we do much the same, with the Hanging of the Greens, or a Christmas Cantata or a Christmas Pageant. In our Adult Sunday School Class, we are preparing in a different way. So often we get caught up in the hustle and bustle of the Season, or we get blinded by the familiar trappings that we don't see the story of the coming of the baby Jesus for the miracle that it is.

This Advent season, the Adult Sunday School Class will take some of the familiar Hymns of Christmas, and look at the birth of Jesus through a different set of eyes. We know the songs and carols by heart, but we don't always know the backgrounds of the music or connect it with our lives or the lives of the people of Jesus' time. Come join us, as we study the meaning of Christmas through:

"Rejoice! Reflections on Four Seasonal Hymns"
