In every difficulty, the words that got them through were – God is here...God is with me...God is with us...right now. Maybe that is what Paul means when he

writes, "in God we live, we move, we have our being."
God's presence in our lives is as certain as the waters
surround the fish of the sea. Brothers and sisters, trust in
the presence of God! Move forward, or fight the good
fight, or receive the peace of God. All will be well.

A number of the brothers and sisters among us are walking a rocky road. Disease, a barely balanced budget, grief, utter weariness, uncertain futures. We all face times like these – but for some, these frightening times await them every single morning.

Remember what the Apostle Paul bravely triumphantly acclaims, "If God is for us, who is against us...who will separate us from the love of Christ? Hardship? Distress? Persecution? Famine? Nakedness? Peril? The sword? No way...we are more than conquerors.. nothing will in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus." Let's be strong for one another...let's stand firm together... God is with us.

CONGREGATIONAL DISCUSSION REGARDING THE FUTURE OF FPCE

What is our current status?

In the recent decades, the First Presbyterian Church of Edgewood has experienced a decline in membership, church attendance, and giving. Over the last 25 years, our membership has decreased from approximately 400 to the most recent count of 90. Weekly Sunday worship service is averaging in the 30's. Along with the decline in membership, the giving by the congregation has decreased. And yet, our beloved church building remains and along with it, the expenses for maintenance. In running our church, personnel and building maintenance are the most significant expenses and for 2019, we are running a deficit budget of close to \$20,000. While we may be able to sustain ourselves under the current operational model for a few years, the Strategic Planning Committee believes that the time is ripe to look for new ways to better serve our Lord.

What is missing from our church?

The greatest element missing from our church is the next generation of young adult members (i.e. people in their 20's, 30's, and 40's). Even if our finances had been in better order, without the next generation, the FPCE is at risk of further decline. How can we make faith and religion relevant to Generation X and the Millennials? What do we need?

The traditional church formula is not working and we are in need of change. Perhaps what we need is a new Christian identity or niche that would make us stand out. If we are successful in advertising our worthwhile cause, people will come from miles away. In this regard, the concept of community reaches out to the greater Pittsburgh East End, not just Edgewood.

What is the solution?

There is no clear solution yet and our eventual decisions may not be to the liking of all. Nonetheless, the Strategic Planning Committee believes that it would be to our best interest not to be insular. We can benefit from building stronger relationships with nearby East End Presbyterian churches. To this effect, we have reached out to Waverly Presbyterian Church, Second UP Presbyterian Church, Forest Hills Presbyterian Church, and Swissvale Presbyterian Church. Of these churches, Waverly Presbyterian Church and Second UP Presbyterian Church have expressed interest in working with us. We have invited representatives from Waverly Presbyterian Church to attend our August session meeting to open our lines of communication. While no concrete plans have been made, possible outcomes include merger, yoked congregations (with a shared pastor), converting parts of our church building to office spaces or other types of rental units, etc. We have hope that through meeting our brothers and sisters in Christ at neighboring churches, the Spirit will guide us. In this time of trial, we ask all of you to pray for answers to better serve our Lord and our community.

Renovation Building Fund

The Building Renovation Fund was approved by Session in 2017 to help fund the church building renovations of which the HVAC upgrade has been completed. It is a three year fund and there are 27 donors that pledged support. The total pledged by the congregation donors is \$78,810 and to date the cash receipts against those pledges is \$61,708.33, so there is a remaining balance of \$17,101.67. An additional \$7,925 was received from donors that exceeded their pledge or did not pledge. Total receipts to date are \$69,633.33 and that is considered a very successful Building Renovation Fund event. The remaining balance in the Building Renovation bank account is \$60,535.90 and that will be used to continue payments on Pittsburgh History and Landmark's loan balance of \$193,029.15. Thank you to every-


