But did you know there is more to our mission than this one sentence? When the team that created the mission statement years ago crafted it, a more fleshed out version was also included, helping to guide us as we move forward in living out the Gospel. As the pastor nominating committee begins its work of discerning who will be the next shepherd for our congregation, a brief self-reflection/mission study occurs as part

of the creation of our Ministry Information Form. While revisiting our mission, the PNC came across this list and thought it was worth sharing with everyone. Consider how we might imagine our congregation's future of love in the community with the following:

We love God ...

- through worship that is dynamic, joyful, exuberant, vibrant, and spirit-filled
- by reading scripture as the inspired Word of God
- by taking time to be holy through prayer

We love each other...

- through fellowship
- by ministering to each other through the Holy Spirit
- by sharing in the sacraments

We love our neighbors...

- through outreach and evangelism
- by doing mission and justice/peacemaking
- with compassion in the name of Jesus

Due to the rise in cases of COVID-19 and the Delta Variant, and in response to Allegheny County moving from the moderate to substantial, and now to the high transmission rate, the Worship Committee/Session has reinstated safety protocols for in-person worship following CDC recommendations as follows:

- Properly worn masks are required for all those attending worship regardless of vaccination status. (Those leading worship may remove masks when speaking or singing unless masking becomes mandated by the Allegheny County Health Department or the Governor.)
- Please continue to observe social distancing in the marked pews.
- Congregational singing may continue while masked. You are welcome to use the hymnals in the pews, stand and join in singing of hymns and responses. Lyrics will continue to be printed in the bulletin for those following along online.



We understand that each person is different with the possible risks he or she may have. Live-streamed online worship will continue to be available on Facebook and YouTube for those who choose to stay home until they feel safe to rejoin in person.

At their August Zoom Session meeting, Session approved:

- The formation of a Music Outreach Task Force to coordinate the use of music programs to encourage people to come to FPCE. Members of this Task Force include Shaun Cloonan, Tyler McGuigan, Tim McKee, Judy Mysels, and Jim Segedy.
- The reinstitution of mask wearing and social distancing during worship.
- The inclusion of the passing of Ed Masten in our church rolls.
- Permission (if the way be clear) for Clutterer's Anonymous to use a second floor room for meetings Monday nights at 6:30-7:30PM for a donation of \$15, increasing to \$25 as membership grows.
- Also in August, Session approved the visit of architectural historian, John Smagner. Mr. Smagner is traveling around the country photo documenting the work of Ralph Adams Cram, who was associated with FPCE.
- The Rev. Cheryl Khyllep moderated the August Session meeting. She will serve as moderator until a new pastor is called.

Treasurer's Report

As of August 30, 2021 the income and expenses for FPCE are as follows:

Total Income - \$111,793.20 Actual YTD Budget - \$127,118.68

Total Expense - \$122,267.57 Actual YTD Budget - \$140,047.64



Actual expenses exceed income by \$10,474.37. The budget at this date projected expenses exceeding income by \$12,928.96 so we actually doing better than what is budgeted. The reason is that maintenance and utility expenses so far this year have been well below budget. The worst period of utility usage has passed, so unless there are unexpected maintenance expenses the year end Total Expenses should be below budget. Congregation donations are below budget and I expect that to continue throughout 2021.

Pastor Nominating Committee Begins Its Work

At the congregational meeting after worship on August 1, the new pastor nominating committee (PNC) was formally elected. Members include Elders Tyler McGuigan (chair) and Lisa Segedy, Deacon John Foster, Lorraine Douthett, and Shaun Cloonan (with alternate: Rhonda Apessos).

The committee met with Associate Minister to Pittsburgh Presbytery Brian Wallace on August 16 for orientation, where the process was explained. Session has tasked the PNC with searching for a full time, installed pastor, rather than the part-time covenant pastor we most recently had. While the process for part time is technically faster, the pool of candidates will be much larger for a full-time search since it will be a national search through the PC(USA) Church Leadership Connection site.

Here is a brief overview of the process we have begun:

Starting Up

- 1. PNC begins meeting, with initial orientation by COM/Branch Minister (complete)
- 2. PNC meets on a regular schedule, with the COM liaison present frequently (begun)
- 3. PNC Prepares Ministry Information Form (MIF) (in process)
- 4. MIF Form approved by Session, COM Liaison, and Branch Minister (goal by end of September)

The Work of Discernment

- 1. PNC receives and reviews Personal Information Forms (PIFs)
- 2. PNC identifies candidates for initial interview
- 3. PNC requests executive reference checks from Presbytery and contacts references of candidates
- 4. PNC conducts additional interview(s), arranges a neutral pulpit if desired, and identifies a finalist(s) to meet with COM for a Clearance interview.
- 5. PNC extends call/offer and negotiates terms of call

Wrapping Up

- 1. Candidate and terms presented to Session for approval; congregational meeting is scheduled.
- 2. First Sunday and "Meet 'n Greet" activities scheduled.
- 3. Pastor begins!

The most important thing that you as a member of the congregation can do for us is PRAY! Pray for guidance, wisdom, and discernment. Pray for our continued ministry at FPCE. Pray for each other and our neighbors. And continue to support what is happening during this "in between" time by attending worship, participating in events, and helping or offering to help when called upon. Now is the time for us to come together and show what it means to be the body of Christ in this corner of the kingdom known as Edgewood.

Growing Pains

Do you remember that TV show from the 80s with the Seaver family? The iconic theme song: "As long as we've got each other, we can take anything that comes our way...sharing the laughter and love." Well, we've got something that has come our way now that we have opened our doors to more groups at FPCE – a new wrinkle we haven't had to think about in quite some time when scheduling events: PARKING!

Our evenings have become quite busy at 120 East Swissvale Avenue lately. Monday and Wednesday the 2 different groups from Vocal Confluence rehearse at 7pm in the Sanctuary (or in several rooms if they break into sectionals). Our Scouts also meet on Monday evenings down in the social room and/or scout room (when it's not flooded). Tuesdays are now rehearsals for the Edgewood Symphony in the sanctuary, and Session typically meets on Tuesday evenings in the Lounge once per month, along with our weekly AA group downstairs. Thursday nights Milepost6 rehearses in the basement band room (former youth room), with the Scouts also sometimes meeting then. And the other 2 AA groups meet Friday and Saturday nights in the Social Room. The new Clutterers group will also meet in the Lounge one night per week.

With all this activity going on, parking spaces are at a premium in our small lot. If you happen to meet during one of these busy times, remember that you CAN park on East Swissvale Avenue in the evenings in front of the side lawn (a sign about limited parking is mostly for buses during school dismissal times). It also means now it's even more critical that folks contact Judy in the office to let her know about groups scheduling meetings. It's quite possible that the space you thought you were going to meet in some evening may not be available to you. Help us to work through our "growing pains" by keeping the office in the loop. It will help us to continue "sharing the laughter and love!"

CROP Walk

On October 10, the Pittsburgh East community will celebrate its 44th year of walking to end hunger one step at a time. The oldest walk in the country, is sponsored by Church World Service (www.churchworldservice.org). 25% of what we raise is returned as grants to East End Common Ministries and



Wilkinsburg Community Ministry. FPCE will participate in this event with walkers Judy and Mariah Mysels and Rhonda Apessos, who aim to raise \$800. If anyone else would like to join our small group of walkers, let Rhonda or Judy know. We gather at the South Avenue United Methodist Church at 1:00 to prepare for the 10K loop through Squirrel Hill and back. The walk distance is 6.2 miles. Walking time is approximately 2.5 hours.
